# Listening

On April 14, 1963, Colonial Avenue Baptist Church was formed. On the charter is written: "The primary purpose of our church will be to seek the salvation of all men everywhere, to strive for the spiritual and moral development of its members, and to oppose evil wherever and whenever it is found." While we use different words now, our mission statement today, 60 years later is the same: to make disciples for Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

For 60 years, Colonial Avenue Baptist Church has been a light on this corner, working with God to make disciples – by sharing the gospel and by helping to guide our members toward closer relationships with God - and to transform the world, through the mission efforts that have been the heartbeat of our church since its beginning. As there are for all groups that are made up of humans, there have been good times and hard times, but through it all, God has continued to work in and through us. Along the way, there have been crossroads, places where the church had to make hard decisions. We are at another crossroads now, in this post-pandemic world that has changed around us and changed us. Who is God calling us to be now? Together we are listening for the answer to that question, particularly asking whether God is calling us to join with Calvary Baptist to form a new church together. If we decide that is not God's will at this time, we will continue to seek what new ways God is calling us that will help us live into our mission to make disciples and transform the world – to bring about the kingdom of heaven that we've been focused on during Lent. Our prayer continues to be that we will be indifferent – to everything except God's will.

The exploration team has put together a survey which will help them listen well to our church members as we listen together to God. In the next few weeks, the survey will be available and will be mailed to those who are unable to attend worship in person. Following this, on April 30, after worship, we will have a listening session, a time for each of us to ask questions and share our thoughts. The exploration team will also share the survey results at that time. Please plan to both fill out the survey and attend the listening session.

I recently read a prayer for the church written by Rev. Emily Swan that is included in The Rhythm of Prayer. I have begun to repeat part of the prayer in my prayers for our church: "Let us stand for Love and with Love, following the way of your Son as best we're able...Let us hear your voice and tangibly feel you with us. Let us discern your guidance. Let us abide in and with you. Show us what you're doing, so we can work together. Move where you will, when you will, in whatever way you will Come, Holy Spirit, and restore your Church."
