# A New Church


What a wonderful Pentecost Sunday we had, celebrating the birth of the church and the coming of the Holy Spirit with song, flames, and birthday cake! As I said in my sermon, it is no coincidence that we celebrated Pentecost the week after we listen to the Spirit's guiding to take a brave step to form a new church with Calvary Baptist Church, believing that this is the best way to bring the kingdom of heaven to earth here in our community. As with many big changes, we are feeling mixed emotions – emotions that come from our deep love for our church. This week, I've heard lots of questions about what our next steps are, and there's been a good bit of anxiety behind some of them. I understand that, and I've certainly experienced some moments of trepidation myself – especially when I have to keep replying, "We don't know...yet."

Here is what I do know: we will begin worshiping together at 10:30 am on June 4. Dr. Steve Pollard and I will rotate preaching responsibilities (and we're actually sharing pulpits with Colonial Presbyterian Church this summer, too, so you'll hear from Rev. Brent Williams three times). You can find a description of our summer worship focus on "Holy Habits" inside this newsletter. The service will be a blend of our services and will feel mostly familiar to you. You may have to scoot over a bit to make room for more folks – and isn't that a great thing! Worship will continue to be live-streamed to our Facebook page and to Calvary's YouTube channel.

We will continue to have our joint mid-week Bible study, as well as participating together in some fellowship and mission activities. In other ways, we will still function as separate churches, until we discern the best way to move forward with legalities and structure. In the next couple of weeks, our exploration (now implementation) team will offer a schedule for moving forward.

More importantly, THIS is what I know: that God has brought us to this time and place, and God will continue to guide us. I imagine the early church shared some of our feelings as they began a brand new thing, but as they focused on being who God called them to be, praying and worshiping together, breaking bread, teaching and being taught, and meeting the needs of their community, something beautiful happened – they became a family of faith, and the church grew as others saw "how good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!" (Psalm 133:1). I am so excited to see the work that God will do in and through us as a new church!
